### **“British Classic Car Heritage”** **An exhibition with more than 35 English sport-and luxury cars!**

Unexpected good news, **during the Easter holidays, from 1<sup>st</sup> through to 17<sup>th</sup> April 2017**, Autoworld’s spotlights will focus on English Classic Cars from the 50’s through to the 70’s.

In excess of 35 cars will bring an insight into those glorious days of the English automotive industry. The most renowned sports cars such as **Austin Healey, MG, Morgan, Sunbeam** and **Triumph** will be on hand. **Daimler** and **Jaguar** luxury models will also be present as also less famous marques such as **Humber, Rover** and **Armstrong Siddele**, not forgetting the **Mini** or the **Rolls Royce** and last but not least the mythical **Land Rover**.

This exhibition has come about thanks to the TEDG (“The English Drivers Guild”) and various private collectors, who will be displaying their glorious models at Autoworld. Ranging from the small and highly popular Mini through to the prestigious Aston Martin and Jaguar models.

As cherry on the cake visitors will have the opportunity to admire two top pre-war models – the **Singer Le Mans** and the **MG J2** from the ‘30s – as also several racing cars such as a **Healey Silverstone** and an **Arnolt Bristol** from the post-war period.

Never have so many English sport - and luxury cars been brought together at Autoworld, in addition to several other British cars within the existing collection.

Up until the ‘80s the English constructors were leaders in the automotive world. Illustrious marques, major worldwide motorsport victories and to this day the cradle of Formula 1.

Since Rover’s demise the British no longer boast a major automotive constructor. The biggest constructor, Jaguar Land Rover, is in Indian hands, and Mini has become German (BMW). Since recently the latter now also build cars at Born in The Netherlands, while JLR will shortly be setting up a new factory in Slovakia.
